Literacy

In Literacy, we will be looking at writing and performing a Public Service Announcement, trying to persuade the public to take extra precaution with hygiene, to prevent further spread of the Coronavirus outbreak. The children will be looking at formal and informal language and recapping skills, such as: colons and semi-colons, parenthesis and modal verbs.



Maths

Continuing into the second half of the spring term, we will be concentrating on fractions, in particular, converting between fractions, decimals and percentages, before starting to look at ratios. To deepen their understanding, we will be using concrete resources, such as: numicon, base 10 and place value counters within place value grids.

Music and Art

Our learning this term is going to focused on the old-school hip-hop song "Prince of Bel Air". As well as learning to sing, play, improvise and compose with this song, children will listen and appraise other classic hip hop songs. In art, we are continuing to compare two key artists, whose work was inspired by human anatomy. Whilst looking at Michelangelo and Leonardo da Vinci, we will focus on developing our sketching skills.

Science

Over the next two half terms, we will be looking at 'Animals including humans' and 'Living things and their habitats', where we will be looking at identifying, sorting, grouping and classifying living things. They will learn how animals are split into 'vertebrates' and 'invertebrates' and begin to consider the differences between living things within these classifications.

Outbreak

PE

This term we will be focusing on orienteering. We will be teaching the key skills of team work, map work and compass skills, as well as re-visiting rolls and movements in gymnastics, with an aim to creating our own routine.

PSHE

In PSHE, we will be continuing with using jigsaw, this term the unit we will be looking at is 'healthy me', where we will be looking at how we can keep our body healthy, through healthy eating and exercise and the factors that can affect health, for example, smoking, drugs and alcohol.

History and Geography

We will continue looking at the different epidemics and pandemics that have affected the different decades, such as cholera, plague, TB etc. and the difference between these diseases and chronic illness', such as cancer, MS. diabetes etc. We will then move on to looking at the differences and changes in medicines and operations, whilst paying homage to the NHS and comparing our health care system, with that of different countries. In Geography, we will be developing our map work skills, looking at the different countries that have been affected by epidemics, pandemics and/or both, we will then move on to where in the world medicines have been created, researched and developed.


