




Here are 8 fun art and craft things for you to try at home.

**Remember** – if you don't have paints at home. You could have a go at making your own. Flour and food colouring works, so does shaving foam and food colouring or you could even paint with coffee – just

<p><b>Handprint Memorial</b></p>	<p>Draw around each person's hand in your household – maybe ask each person to design their hand differently if you don't have coloured paper. Stick them on top of each other with the phrase "When the world stayed apart, this was my favourite place to be". This will act as a perfect memorial as we are living through history.</p>	
<p><b>Make a puppet!</b></p>	<p>Find an old sock to make a sock puppet. Could you make your favourite book or film character as your puppet? Try and use a variety of materials and attachment techniques to make your puppet more interesting – design and draw it in your book to help you plan. It would be good to see if some of you can sew some of your puppet together!</p>	
<p><b>Cress Head!</b></p>	<p>You will need: empty yogurt pot (or similar), cotton wool, kitchen roll, seeds, water and decorative items. Design your funny face on your pot – make it as funny as you can! Plant the seeds (cress works perfectly) evenly into the pot placing them on top of wet kitchen roll and cotton wool. Place in a warm place which gets sunlight and watch your cress head grow. Take a photo and put it in your books.</p>	
<p><b>I have seen the future...</b></p>	<p>In your books, draw a simple sketch – what do you think you will look like twenty years in the future? Think about what will change – your hair colour? Your height? What will your job be? What will your family look like?</p>	
<p><b>NS Rainbow</b></p>	<p>Using the colours of the rainbow (remember the mnemonics is Richard Of York Gave Battle In Vain – red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet), create your very own rainbow to display in your window. You can use anything: paints, colouring pencils, coloured paper, stamping ink etc.</p>	
<p><b>Windssocks</b></p>	<p>You will need: Recycled Can, Paint &amp; Paintbrushes, Glue, Assorted Ribbons (you could also use coloured paper), Optional embellishments like Glitter, Stickers, Gemstones, Sequins, etc. and Masking Tape or Duct Tape Start by painting the can in colours of your choice. After the paint is dry, use glue to attach colourful ribbons to the bottom rim of the can. You could also add a ribbon to the top of the can for hanging.</p>	
<p><b>Rocky Road</b></p>	<p>You will need: 75g digestive biscuits, 150g marshmallows, 100g butter, 2 tbsp golden syrup, 350g chocolate. Line a brownie tin with parchment paper. Crumble the biscuits into a large bowl. Snip the marshmallow in half and add those to the bowl too. Put the butter and golden syrup in a heatproof bowl and place in microwave until completely melted. Put the chopped chocolate in a heatproof bowl then pour the melted butter and syrup mixture over it and leave to sit for a couple of minutes. Now stir until the chocolate is smooth and has melted then</p>	

	<p>pour the whole lot over the biscuits and marshmallows. Stir to coat all the pieces in chocolate, then pour into the brownie tin. Leave to set in the fridge.</p>	
<b>Foam Paint</b>	<p>You will need: shaving cream, glue, food colouring and a zip lock bag. Mix equal parts shaving cream and glue into a Ziplock bag, add your desired food colouring and then, with the bag sealed, squish the bag together until all your ingredients are nicely mixed together.</p>
