Choose one task from each subject to complete each week.

READING

With your character pebbles (see our art home learning) see if you can make up your own story with your sibling or grown up.

What is your favourite story? Can you read your favourite story to mummy or daddy all by yourself?

Can you try reading a new story to mummy? Look at the pictures and make up your own story.

What is the first sound in your name? What other words do you know that have the same sound at the beginning?

What is the first sound in your name? What does it look like? Can you find your sound when reading a book or outside on signs?

Write some simple words on lego bricks and letters on the smaller bricks, can you match the letters to make a word?

WRITING

Using your reusable painting (see art home learning) can you write the first sound in your name? Can you write your name?

Draw some patterns zig zags, swirls, loops, shapes. Can your child trace or copy the patterns that you have drawn?

Find some old cars or toys with wheels. Fill a plate with paint and drive through the paint. What can you draw with your car?

Chalk a hopscotch outside and write in the letter sounds that you know, play with your siblings or grown up, shout the letters as you jump.

Outside on the ground can you chalk a road for your cars to drive on. Don't forget to put the lines in the middle!

Make some goop with cornflour and water in a flat baking tray. Write your names and draw shapes in the goop.



MATHS

Jelly Number Hunt. Make up some jelly and before it sets place inside some plastic numbers. Once set can you find the numbers in the wobbly jelly?

Lego Patterns – Draw some coloured blocks onto card and then let your child copy the patterns you have created with lego blocks.

Write numbers one to six onto post it notes, roll a dice and then smack the matching number.

Draw a hopscotch grid outside with chalk and put numbers inside. Play with your family and siblings, as you jump on a square shout out the number.

Share some sweets with your family, how many sweets do you have? Eat one, how many do you have now? Who has the most, who has the fewest?

Look at the coins in Mummy's purse. See what numbers you can find. A 1, 2, 5, 10 or maybe some bigger numbers?

MUSIC

Using an iPad or tablet, record your self singing your favourite song or Nursery rhyme. Play it back for mum and dad.

Listen to your favourite song and draw on paper in time to the music. What does your picture look like?

Choose the music channel on TV, can you dance in time to the music? How many different ways can you move your body?

Can you find lots of different pots, pans and bowls in the kitchen and make some music with a wooden spoon?

Can you drum your pots and pans in time to some music?

Can you learn a brand-new Nursery Rhyme by heart? How many new ones can you learn, can you sing all the words?

KNOWLEDGE OF WORLD

Look in the mirror, who do you look like, mum, dad, brother, sister? What colour is your hair, whose is the same or different?

How many different bugs do you know of that have 6 legs? Can you find them in your garden?

Ask mum to put a small toy in a balloon with water and freeze overnight. How can you get the toy out? Salt, warm water, toffee hammer? Which works best?

Make a ramp outside in the garden and roll different toy vehicles down the ramp. Who's goes the furthest? Whose was the fastest? Why did that happen?

Before bed time, have a look out of the window at the moon, what shape is the moon? Draw a picture. One week later on the same day have another look at the moon. How has the shape of the moon changed?

How many different natural colours can you find in the garden? Can you find every colour? How many different green colours can you find?
