During Year 6, children should have experience of the following historical skills:

- Place current study on time line in relation to other studies
- Use relevant dates and terms
- Find out about beliefs, behaviour and characteristics of people, recognising that not everyone shares the same views and feelings
- Write another explanation of a past event in terms of cause and effect using evidence to support and illustrate their explanation
- · Know key dates, characters and events of time studied
- Link sources and work out how conclusions were arrived at
- · Consider ways of checking the accuracy of interpretations fact or fiction and opinion
- · Be aware that different evidence will lead to different conclusions
- Confidently use the library and internet for research
- Recognise primary and secondary sources
- · Use a range of sources to find out about an aspect of time past
- Bring knowledge gathered from several sources together in a fluent account
- · Select and organise information to produce structured work, making appropriate use of dates and terms
