Explore some story books you have at home, search the internet for stories or listen to a children's audio book, whichever way is easiest and whatever you have access to. From the stories you have listened to, think about the main characters within the stories and jot down or draw what you liked most about them. What other parts of the story or stories grabbed your attention? Were there any words in the stories that you were unfamiliar with? Immersion – Phonics and vocabulary Using words that you discovered within the last activity whilst reading stories, create a word bank and add them to the list below. Using the word bank you have created and the vocabulary list below can you visualise each word? Ask an adult to help you to read the list of words and for each word draw a picture of it on a piece of paper and label it with that word. Remember to sound out the letters, blending the sounds to help you to remember the spellings of these words. These words are words you will need to use often within your writing. Using the conjunction 'and' Recap on the previous learning above when you began to use the conjunction 'and'. Remind yourself when we would use the conjunction 'and' You may want to watch the video from previous learning again. (Link to session 3 opposite.) 'and' is part of the group of conjunctions called 'coordinating conjunctions' They include: for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so. To help you remember these conjunctions remember that if you take the first letter of each of the words, it spells out the word FANBOYS, so if you remember FANBOYS, this will remind you of the coordinating conjunctions in that group. Now For this piece of writing, we are focusing on using 'and', we use this coordinating conjunction when we are wanting to join words, phrases or clauses together. For example: On my sandwich I had cheese and tomato. To help you to practice using 'and', play the game with an adult or sibling, 'I went the shop and I bought' Click the link opposite to give you full instructions on how to play the game. Use drawings to help you to visualise what you are going to write about and to feed your imagination. Write Using your plan, you will now begin to write your story. Remember to write a title for your story. (This should be in the centre of the first line on your paper. Miss a line from your title and at the edge of the paper (the start of the new line). Here you will begin your writing. Take your time and ensure that you are writing neatly and on the line. Use the checklist below to check your writing. I am correctly forming my letters. I am writing neatly and on the line. I am starting my sentences with a capital letter. I am using full stops correctly. I have used the conjunction 'and' correctly within my writing. Remember to stop and read your writing, checking that it makes sense and that words are spelt correctly, Use your phonics knowledge to help you to sound out words. Use your plan and your pictures to help you to make good use of a range of adjectives to make your writing interesting. When you have finished your piece of writing, read it back to yourself and check for meaning and any mistakes that you have made. Read your story to an adult or sibling and ask for their feedback. Use this feedback to improve your writing. Edit then write up for a final piece.
