English

Maths

We will be continuing to work through our core concepts in Maths to ensure your children have all the key skills ready for secondary school. This half term we shall be revisiting algebra, which we know the children found challenging during remote learning, as well as area and perimeter.

Geography

We will be looking at the key countries that refugees come from and where the largest camps are located; placing them on a world map and comparing them.

RE

Our RE day will allow us to focus and learn about creation stories, different places of worship and the diversity of different religions and cultures in Doncaster; being able to understand and reflect upon this.

PSHE

Relationships Changing Me

History

We will be having a 'Decades Theme Day' based on looking at changes in Britain from the 1930s to present. We will be seeing how fashions, music and technology has changed over time.
