#### Literacy

In Literacy, we will be focusing on 'The word of mouse' book, which will also coincide with our reading, where we will be reading the book and exploring it. The book is about: a very special mouse, who escapes from a lab to find his missing family. It is a charming story of survival, determination, and the power of friendship. As our topic is medicines and medical research, we will be slightly looking into animal testing and children will be writing a balanced argument — for or against animal testing. I am sure from the book, children will disagree and it will be interesting to read their amazing arguments!

#### Maths

In Maths, we will be focusing on a variety of aspects: shape, translation and reflection and how to read timetables and answer questions about these timetables (buses, trains and school timetables). Towards the end of term, we will be focusing on maths retention of certain learning that we have previously learnt e.g. multiply by IO, IOO and I,OOO, rounding, fractions and decimal equivalents, towards the end of term, which will be interesting to see.

#### Art and Music

We will be looking at Egyptian Art and be creating a piece similar of this, using Egyptian techniques. In terms of music, we will be focusing on the song ", where we will learn how to compose the song.

## Outbreak

#### PΕ

This term we will be focusing on Athletics. Children will learn a variety of athletic skills over the term: learning the meaning of endurance and this type of running, sprinting, relay races and running, jumping and throwing techniques.

#### Science

We will be continuing our focus on 'Animals including humans' and 'Living things and their habitats', where we will create animal life cycles and be able to explain the process of life cycles of an animal and a human being.

#### **PSHE**

In PSHE, we will be continuing with using Jigsaw. However, we will be having more of a focus on E-safety. This will be useful for the children to understand the E-safety rules.

#### History

This term we will be continuing to focus on Ancient Egyptians. Children will continue to learn about why the River Nile was significant to Ancient Egypt, studying and learning Hieroglyphics and why Moses had to leave Egypt. As well as this, children will be finishing their adventure story writing, of their venture in Egypt and visiting the tombs, which the children have been very enthusiastic about.

#### Geography

We will be continuing to use map work skills, looking at the different countries that have been affected by epidemics, pandemics and/or both, we will then move on to where in the world medicines have been created, researched and developed. We will also be discovering the meaning of latitude and longitude.


