LITERACY

In Literacy, we will be focusing on our Global Citizenship Curriculum of Sustainability. We will be beginning by learning all about the history of space travel and the huge developments since the first human in space in 1961. We will be using the book, Curiosity, to learn all about the advancements in the exploration of different planets and will be writing information texts around this.

We will then be moving on to immersing ourselves in the possibility of being the first person to travel to Mars. We will be imagining what this would feel like and the range of emotions we would go through when making that journey, not knowing whether we would ever return. We will be using SpaceX as our stimulus and will be exploring the range of reusable rockets currently being used to support sustainable space travel.

During reading, we will be supporting our previous learning on Ancient Greece by reading, Who Let the Gods Out? By Maz Evans.

In reading, we will be continuing to develop the six main skills of reading; background knowledge, fluency, visualise, vocabulary, comprehension and summarise.

We are having a huge push on home/school reading. Please encourage your child to read and change their reading book as much as possible. Comments are no longer required as a discussion around the book will take place before changing.

Science + ICT

During our Science sessions, we will be focusing on electricity. We will be exploring which appliances use electricity and how electrical circuits work. We will also be learning about a variety of different scientists and the fascinating things they discovered.

Within ICT, we will be focusing on spreadsheets. We will be learning how to format cells and use a variety of functions to calculate data.

PE This half term we will be taking part in FlexDance. This will take place every Wednesday and will be done inside. Please ensure plasters are provided if your child wears stud earrings that cannot be removed.

Theme

Our global citizenship curriculum focus for this half term is, Sustainability. We will be exploring the question, 'What does it mean to live sustainably and what is being done to protect the planet?'

MATHS

During this half term, we will be focusing on multiplication and division. We will be exploring a variety of different methods and using different manipulatives to support us when solving problems.

We will be continuing to develop our known number facts by using derivation boards for different calculations. If you would like some of these for home to practise, please just ask!

Times tables are a crucial part of the Year 4 curriculum. By the end of Year 4, children should be able to recall all multiplication and division facts up to 12 x 12. Remember to log in to TTRS at home to practise as much as possible. If you require a log in, please ask Mrs Bailey on the door and these will be sent out the same day.
