Literacy

In Literacy, we will be focusing on the Loch Ness monster. The unit will be a project, where pupils need to research facts about the Loch Ness monster, what it looks like, whether there have been sightings and if they are true or not. Pupils will create their own facts about the Loch Ness monster, to then collate this together and create their own non-chronological report.

Maths

This term, we will be consolidating our maths skills to complete real-life problems, looking at banks. We will look into how we budget and what the purpose of banks are. Later in the term, we will complete some fun activities, that will consolidate our learning.

History

This term we will be finishing our Cold War unit, looking at the Space Race and the Korean and Vietnam War. Then we will focus on human rights, looking at Martin Luther King.

Art

We will be continuing our skill learning on Henri Rousseau, to ensure that we can re-create one of his pieces (rainforests) in our own style, using sketching techniques, as well as painting and collage.

Geography

As part of our rainforest learning, we will link this with geography by looking at biomes. We will also be looking at tribes within the rainforests, in South America.

In regards to mapping skills, we will be looking at map symbols and the eight points of a compass.

Later in the term, we will also be consolidating the water cycle and natural resources.

Rainforests and Global Warming

PE

This term we will focusing on cricket and rounders, supporting children with sportsmanship. Please ensure that your child brings their P.E. kit, either at Monday and leaves this in school or on a Thursday. A reminder that P.E. kit is black shorts and a plain white t-shirt.

This term we will be learning to be compassionate global citizens. We will look at the rainforest and how global warming and deforestation affect us all!

Science

We will be finishing our evolution learning with an investigation, where we will look at different bird beaks. We will then spend the rest of the half term focusing on our final science unit of light, where we will look at how we see and changing of shadows.

P4C

Our P4C learning this term will focus on current issues with deforestation. As well as this, we will focus on transition so that the children are able to feel comfortable with this.
