Literacy

In Literacy we will be developing our basic skills in handwriting, sentence structure and correct use of punctuation. We will be focussing on the book "stone soup" as our stimulus and children will retell the story in their own words.

Maths

In Art, we will be researching the work of Giuseppe Arcimboldo. In DT, we will be cooking up some treats and using mechanics to design pop up cards.
