Foundation Stage 2

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

We will be using our knowledge of feelings and emotions to think about other people's perspectives than our own, using characters in stories as well as important dates such as Remembrance Day and children in need to do this.

Physical Development

Children will continue to develop both their fine and gross motor skills using the inside and outside learning environments.

We will continue our focus on fine motor skills and pencil control, especially accurate letter formation for name writing. This can be supported at home with lots of activities like playdough and and colouring activities that all strengthen the finger muscles as well as practising name writing.

Communication and Language

We will continue to develop our speaking and listening skills through our provision and class discussions. We will encourage the children to share their thoughts, ideas and opinions.

Understanding of the World

During our project learning this half term children will be thinking

about different peoples' beliefs and the traditions and celebrations linked to these. As well as this we will be thinking about seasonal changes, specifically autumn and winter.

<u>Literacy</u>

This half term we will continue to learn new sounds, and practise our blending skills and letter formation in order to read and write simple words during phonics.
